- [1] Both appellants, members of the Jamaica Constabulary Force, were tried and convicted before Her Hon Mrs Grace Henry-McKenzie in the Resident Magistrate Court Corporate Area (now Parish Court), for offences under the Corruption Prevention Act, on 26 July 2019. Both appellants were convicted for corruptly soliciting \$100,000.00 from the complainant Mr Christopher Evan Soutar. Additionally, the appellant Otwani Deer was convicted for corruptly receiving \$50,000.00 from Mr Soutar. Valerie McIntosh was sentenced to six months' imprisonment. Otwani Deer was sentenced to concurrent terms of nine months' imprisonment on each count.
- [2] Valerie McIntosh appealed both her conviction and sentence. Otwani Deer appealed against his sentences only.
- [3] Having heard the appeal, we determined that:
 - (a) Valerie McIntosh's conviction was unimpeachable.

- (b) In the case of both appellants, the sentences were manifestly excessive.
- [4] We therefore made the following orders:

In the case of Valerie McIntosh:

- 1. The appeal against conviction is dismissed.
- 2. The conviction is affirmed.
- 3. The appeal against sentence is allowed.
- 4. The sentence of six months' imprisonment is set aside. Substituted therefor is a sentence of six months' imprisonment, suspended for 18 months.
- 5. The sentence is reckoned as having commenced on 26 July 2019, the date on which it was imposed.

In the case of Otwani Deer:

- 1. The conviction is affirmed.
- 2. The appeal against sentence is allowed.
- 3. The sentence of nine months' imprisonment, imposed on each count, is set aside. Substituted therefor, on each count, is a sentence of nine months' imprisonment, suspended for two years, to run concurrently.

The sentences are reckoned as having commenced on 26 July 2019, the date on which they were imposed.
